

## MISSOURI BAPTIST UNIVERSITY APPLICATION FOR SENIOR PERMISSION

Undergraduate students may be eligible to earn graduate credit during their senior year. The following guidelines apply to Senior Permission applicants:

- 1. Students applying must meet ALL of the criteria:
  - Earned at least 90 hours of credit prior to applying
  - Cumulative grade point average of 3.000
  - May not be enrolled for more than 16 credit hours during any semester in which a senior permission course is taken
  - Must complete a Senior Permission Application, get advisor's signature, and submit the form to the Graduate Office by the end of the second week of classes
- 2. Seniors will register for any dually listed (400/500) course as undergraduates (for 400-level courses) and will be charged undergraduate tuition.
- 3. Students may be eligible to take up to 12 hours of graduate credit, with a maximum of 6 hours per semester (or 3 hours per 8 week session).
- 4. The Graduate Office will notify students and their instructors if they have met the eligibility requirements and have been approved to complete the course for graduate credit. Students who elect not to pursue graduate credit after approval has been granted must notify the Graduate Office in writing.
- 5. Students must earn a grade of "A" or "B" in the dually listed course to receive Senior Permission Graduate credit. A grade of "C" or lower will not be accepted for Senior Permission Graduate credit.
- 6. At the end of each semester, instructors will notify the Graduate Office of those students who have successfully completed graduate-level requirements. *It is the student's responsibility* to contact the instructor and confirm that he/she has submitted the proper verification to the Graduate Office. At that time, the undergraduate course will be updated to a graduate course on the transcript.
